Course Description

HPV immunization rates are significantly lower than other adolescent vaccines. Common barriers include ineffective provider communication, inadequate provider knowledge, and parent misinformation. Learn how a clinically integrated network improved HPV vaccination performance from below the national 50th percentile (14.13%; baseline network rate 8%) to above the national 90th percentile (22.63%) in two years. The network drove impact by collaborating with infectious disease specialists, communicating resources and best practices, and effectively using data and population health technology. In just 2 years, the network was able to demonstrate a 288% increase in HPV immunization performance. While the increase itself is significant, the fact that the increase was demonstrated across a network of 23 independent practices with 188 primary care providers in more than 30 locations is noteworthy.

Target Audience

Health plan and institutional partners involved in HPV vaccination, including primary care providers, pediatricians, nurses, OB/GYN providers, quality directors, office staff, etc.
