



What's New for 2023!

The Annual Dental Visit (ADV) measure has been retired for MY 2023, and two new dental HEDIS measures have been added:

- 1. Oral Evaluation, Dental Services (OED)
 - The previous ADV measure was any visit with a dental practitioner in the measurement year. The new OED measure will be a comprehensive or periodic oral evaluation.
- 2. Topical Fluoride for Children (TFC)

Oral Evaluation, Dental Services (OED)

NEW Measure for 2023

Members under 21 years of age who received a comprehensive or periodic oral evaluation *with* a dental provider during the measurement year. Reporting age groups:

- 0-2
- 3-5
- 6-14
- 15-20
- Total

Coding

CDT: D0120, D0145, D0150





Topical Fluoride for Children (TFC)

NEW Measure for 2023

Members 1-4 years of age who received at least two fluoride varnish applications during the measurement year. Reporting age groups:

- 1-2 years
- 3-4 years
- Total

Coding

CPT: 99188

CDT: D1206

Cavities are one of the most common chronic conditions in children and topical fluoride applications are a preventive treatment for tooth decay.



Dental Care Challenges

Why Gaps in Care?



Parent/caregiver lack of understanding/awareness of:

- Dental benefits for 2x/year dental check-ups
- Recommendations to take to dentist no later than age 2, preferably by age 1 or when first tooth erupts
- Importance of early dental care to prevent significant problems
- 'Dental well-visit' just as important as medical well-visit
- May not realize still need to see the dentist after PCP measures (oral risk assessment, fluoride, etc)



- Geographical / county location
- Age groups 1–3-year-olds and 18–20-year-olds
- Fear / anxiety child or parent
- Child cooperation
- Although fluoride can be applied by the PCP office or a dental provider for TFC, a visit to a dental provider for appropriate care must occur to make the OED measure compliant.



- Lack of dental referral / recommendation by PCP, particularly before/by age 2
- Dental providers that do not see Medicaid members
- Dental providers that do not see patients before age 2-3
 - OED includes members that turn 1 in the measurement year, all the way up to age 20



Take-Away Actions

Assess for dental home and last dental visit

at every well-visit (or when in-office if no well-visit yet in MY) Refer for dentist visit no later than age 2

Ideally by 1 yr old, or can be as early as 1st tooth eruption Educate
parents/caregiver
/older
adolescents

Benefits for 2x/year dental check-ups

Assist member to establish dental home if needed

Of \$25 gift card for 2-3-yearolds **Educate that** dental well-visit

Is just as important as medical well-visit

Take-Away Actions

Educate parents / caregivers that dental decay

Can lead to significant health issues

Consider fluoride application in PCP office

Remember: Fluoride can be applied at the PCP office for the TFC measure, but referral to a dentist for appropriate care must occur to be compliant for OED measure

Provide oral health/ dental anticipatory guidance

Reinforce that dentist visit is also necessary in addition to PCP education Consider partnering with ABHWV for dental wellness event

If dental services are available on-site
